Spanish 1

Unit 1

Formal and informal dialogues. Greetings and farewells. Introducing oneself and others. Asking for and giving personal information: name, origin, marital status, nationality, profession or occupation. The alphabet. Spelling. Identifying and describing other people.

Unit 2

The family tree. Ties among people. Physical and personality traits. Expressing possession. Numbers from 0 to 1000. Mathematical operations. Clothing items, shoes, accessories and jewelry; their characteristics: color, material, prints, texture, size and number; clothing for different occasions. Vowels, diphthongs.

Unit 3

Public places. The letters b, v, p. Job and housing ads. Indicating the existence of places, people or objects. Expressing the location of a place. Numbers from 1000 to 5 000 000. The rooms in a house and their furniture. Expressing location in space. Intonation patterns. Question and exclamation marks. Expressing a continuous action in the present.

Unit 4

The time. Days of the week and parts of the day. Food preferences and meal schedules. The months and seasons of the year. The letters c, q, k and g. Birthdays and objects to be given as presents. Invitations and apologizing. Good, bad, a little, a lot and plenty. Talking about the weather. Interrogative words.

Unit 5

Body parts. Expressing the health condition, symptoms, feelings and needs. A little, a lot, intense, strong and plenty. At the doctor's office. The letters g and j. Expressing physical states, states of being or temporary emotions. The letters d and t. Expressing actions at home, school or work, in the daily life, free time and the manufacturing, construction or making of an object.

Unit 6

Vacation activities. Expressing preferences. Expressing future actions. Plans, trips, destinations, places and baggage. The letters c(+a, o, u); qu(+e, i); k. The letters c(+e,i); s, z, l, r.

Scope

Level A1 CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference)

- Can understand and use frequent daily expressions, as well as simple phrases meant to satisfy immediate needs.
- Can introduce themselves and others, ask for and give basic personal information about their address, belongings and people they know.
- Can interact in an elementary way as long as their interlocutor speaks slowly, clearly and is willing to cooperate.
